

BWGA Tuesday Tournaments FAQ 2016

When and how do I sign up for a tournament?

Sign up using the tee time application on the internet by 2 PM on the Thursday before the tournament. The link to the Google forms application is on the BWGA website.

What if I need to cancel on the day(s) before the tournament?

Call or email Linda Murphy or call the Pro Shop

What if I need to cancel on the morning of the tournament?

Call the Pro Shop

What happens if I am late for my tee time?

If a group behind you has an open slot, join that group. If there are no open slots, withdraw from tournament and your entry fee will be refunded.

What if I start the round and realize I did not put money in for Closest to Pin?

When you check in on Tuesday the Pro Shop staff will collect \$7.00 (\$5 for tournament and \$2 for pins). If you did not pay at the desk, you will not be included in Pins. You may opt out when checking in.

What happens if I paid my entry fee but cannot finish the 18 hole tournament?

Mark your card that you withdrew (WD). The entry fee will not be refunded.

You can enter your adjusted scores for the holes missed in the GHIN Handicap system.

Do I have to put my score into the GHIN system each time I play a tournament?

Yes

What if I want to play with friends?

Put in a request to Linda Murphy who will accommodate you if possible.

Who can cancel a tournament?

Tournament Director

Must I pick up my ball after 10 strokes?

Yes. To keep up the pace of play, if you have not holed out on your 10th stroke, pick up and score an X 10 for that hole. A score of X 10 also applies if you are “out of a hole” and choose to pick up at any time. The scores on the tournament card are NOT adjusted for your handicap. You adjust the scores only when you enter them in the GHIN system.

Do we need to keep 2 score cards for a tournament?

Yes, to be sure the correct scores have been written on the card or if the card is lost during the round.

Score cards must be neat, list players by Last Name and First Initial, signed and attested.

You are responsible for protecting the field, be honest with your scores and if there is any question about scores, bring it to the attention of the Tournament Director before the card is signed and attested.
